Human Trafficking = Modern-Day Slavery

Human trafficking is the recruitment, harboring, transporting, providing or obtaining by any means any person for forced labor, slavery or servitude in any industry or site such as agriculture, construction, prostitution, manufacturing, begging, domestic service or marriage. An estimated 800,000 people, of which approximately 80 percent are women and up to 50 percent are minors, are trafficked across national borders. This number does not include the millions of people who are trafficked within their countries of origin. (Trafficking in Persons Report, U.S. Department of State, 2008).

Some 2.5 million people throughout the world are at any given time recruited, entrapped, transported and exploited — a process called human trafficking (U.N. Office on Crime and Drugs, cited in U.N. Human Trafficking Rapporteur's report of March 2009)

The International Labor Organization (ILO) — the United Nations agency charged with addressing labor standards, employment and social protection issues — estimates that there are 12.3 million people in forced labor, bonded labor, forced child labor and sexual servitude at any given time; other estimates range from 4 million to 27 million. (Trafficking in Persons Report, U.S. Department of State, 2008).

Affirming that Jesus Christ came that "they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10b), the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has convened a roundtable from among its ministries to address human trafficking together with synods, presbyteries and local congregations. The roundtable includes representatives from Child Advocacy, Immigration, World Mission, Presbyterian Hunger Program, Mission Responsibility through Investment,

Presbyterian Women, Jinishian Memorial Program and Presbyterian Health Education and Welfare.

Dear Family & Friends,

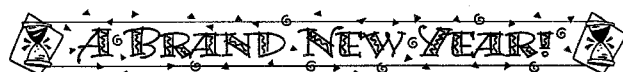



Jack Perdue, 80 of Pine Bluff, died Saturday, December 11, 2010 at Jefferson Regional Medical Center in Pine Bluff. Services were held Tuesday, December 14, at Central Presbyterian Church with Dr. Dan Festa officiating. Interment followed at Graceland Cemetery.

Born in Pine Bluff on May 7, 1930 as John Armer Perdue, III, a son of the late John Armer Perdue, Jr. and Elise Russell Perdue, he was reared and received his early education in Pine Bluff, attended Hendrix College, and graduated from the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville where he was a member of Sigma Chi Fraternity.

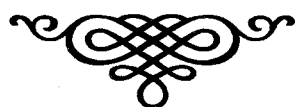
He served in the US Army at Fort Bliss where he worked on the Skywarn radar system project with RCA system designers.

Returning to Pine Bluff, he joined his father and uncle in the family printing and office supply business, The Perdue Company. He worked for Perdue's until the business was sold in 1990, and he retired in 1992. He was a member of the Pine Bluff Rotary Club, Greenback Investment Club, and was a member and Elder at Central Presbyterian Church.

Jack enjoyed playing golf, boating, and later fishing, all of which he enjoyed with his many friends. Very skilled in working with his hands, as a young boy he built scale models of WWII vintage airplanes. As an adult he enjoyed flying remote controlled model aircraft. An avid reader, he recently revealed himself as a "closet watercolorist" when he showed a portfolio of his paintings.

His survivors include his wife, Mary Alice "Ann" James Perdue, who he married in 1977; two daughters, Myra Perdue Baran and her husband, Mark of Little Rock, Arkansas, Rosemond Perdue of Los Angeles, California; two brothers, David R. Perdue of Pine Bluff and Richard M Perdue of Little Rock; and three grandchildren, CeCe Cranner, John Armer Perdue Baran, and Burette "Ret" Miller Baran.

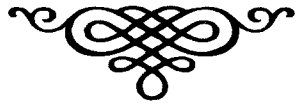
Youth News

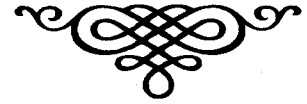

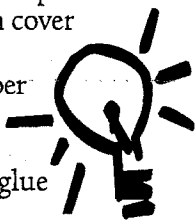


LIGHT SWITCH COVER

Everyone who believes in God and lives for him is a child of light. Make this cover for your bedroom light switch to remind you to be a light for God.

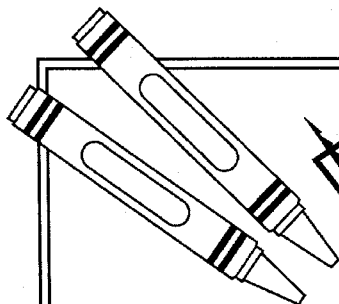
What you need:

- An adult to help
- Light switch cover
- Screwdriver
- Colored paper
- Markers
- Scissors
- Decoupage glue
- Paintbrush
- Craft knife



What you do:

1. Remove the screws from the cover.
2. On the paper, draw small images related to light and write out "Live as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8, NIV).
3. Cut out the drawings and verse. Make sure they'll fit on the cover.
4. Paint the cover with a coat of decoupage glue, and then immediately place the drawings and verse on the cover.
5. Paint over them with another coat of glue. Let it dry.
6. Turn the cover over and use a craft knife to cut out the opening for the light switch.
7. Using a screwdriver, place your new light switch cover on your wall.
