A Word About Stewardship of Your Health

You are the most important person on your health care team. That means that choices we make everyday affect us, and those we love, or those who love us. While sometimes we are very careful to make every effort to get well when we are ill, some of us seem to have greater difficulty taking the necessary daily steps to remain healthy.

A series of articles on health enhancing choices are planned for the next year, and will appear monthly, as a courtesy from the Christian Education and Nurture Committee of the Session. Dr. Laura Festa will be authoring those articles, and will be happy to answer any questions, within her scope of practice, that you might have.

This first article is about a vaccine that you may want to plan to get your health provider to order for you. The vaccine is for the Shingles, which is a herpes zoster infection. Shingles can be quite painful, and after the active outbreak of the Shingles, the one who experiences Shingles can have significant persistent nerve pain along the pathway of the nerves affected.

As of April 30, 2011, the Mayo Clinic website, <http://www.mayoclinic.com/health/vaccines/MY01188/SECTIONGROUP=2>, offers the following information on the Shingles vaccine:

- **Who needs to get the Shingles vaccine?** Get the Shingles vaccine if **you're older than age 60.**
- **When should one get the Shingles vaccine?** **Get one dose of the Shingles vaccine at your first opportunity after you turn 60.** Better yet, plan ahead with your health care provider (M.D., Osteopathic Physician, Advanced Practice Nurse), so that your provider can insure that vaccine is available for you. The vaccine is in

high demand and the supply of vaccine available is sometimes sufficiently limited to prompt delay between the date your health care provider orders that vaccine and when your pharmacy can get a dose available.

- **Who should not take the vaccine?** Shingles vaccine isn't recommended if:
 - **you're pregnant** (not likely for 60 year olds, unless we are retelling the Sarah and Abraham story).
 - **you're currently ill**, it is not wise to have the vaccine
 - **you have ever had an allergic reaction to gelatin, the antibiotic neomycin or any other component of the Shingles vaccine, you should not get the vaccine as you are likely to have an allergic reaction to the vaccine, or**
 - **you have a weakened immune system, or you're receiving medical treatments such as steroids, radiation or chemotherapy, or you have a history of bone or lymphatic cancer it would not be appropriate to have the vaccine.**

One episode of Shingles **does not** protect against future episodes. Researchers followed 1,669 patients who had an episode of herpes zoster infection (Shingles); follow-up was an average of 7.3 years (as long as 12 in some cases). In this study, published in the February issue of *Mayo Clinic Proceedings*, researchers found that the rate of recurrence in the study group was similar to the rate of first episodes, with some patients having as many as three recurrences. The high recurrence rate suggests that **herpes zoster vaccination should be offered to people who have had an episode of Shingles to prevent recurrence.** conclude the authors.

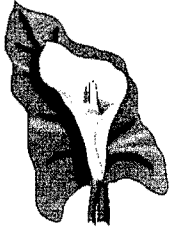

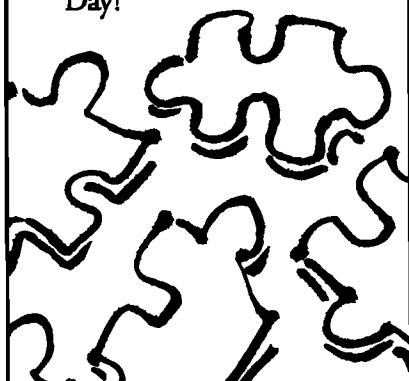
